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SNBC Enrollment

- Persons aged 18 through 64 are eligible to enroll in SNBC.
- April 1, 2016 SNBC Enrollment:
 - Total Enrollment 51,640
 - Dual: 27,026
 - Number of Enrollees 65 and older 2,121
 - Duals: 1540
 - Currently SNBC enrollees who turn age 65 after enrollment have the option to remain enrolled in SNBC.
- April 1, 2016 Enrollment in Northern Counties that will be transitioning to a new health plan or returning to FFS.
 - Total number of enrollees: 8101
 - Number of People 65 and over: 259

SNBC Enrollee Access to Home and Community Based Services

- In addition to the comprehensive primary and acute care services SNBC health plans cover the following home and community based services:
 - skilled nurse visits,
 - home health aide and
 - home care therapy
- People on SNBC may receive personal care assistance (PCA) and home care nursing (HCN). Services are authorized and paid on a fee-for-service basis.
- People on SNBC may receive services authorized under all disability waiver programs. Waiver services are authorized and paid fee-for-service.
 - Brain Injury (BI), Community Alternative Care (CAC), Community Access for Disability Inclusion (CADI), Developmental Disability (DD) waivers
- People in need of Elderly Waiver (EW) services can not access EW services while they are enrolled in SNBC.

Seniors Enrollment in Other MN Medicaid Managed Care Programs

- Most people enrolled in families and children who turn 65 are mandated into managed care and have choice of two programs.
 - Minnesota Senior Care Plus (MSC+) is a program for people who have Medical Assistance (MA) with or without Medicare. With MSC+, you get your medical services provided through the health plan of your choice and you choose a separate plan for your Medicare Part D drug coverage.
 - Minnesota Senior Health Options (MSHO) is a program that combines all of the benefits of MSC+ with Medicare benefits into one program. MSHO provides care coordination to assist the member with finding and using services covered by MA and Medicare.
- People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ may CONTINUE to receive services authorized under all disability waiver programs.
 - Waiver services continue to be paid Fee-for- Service.
 - People continue with county or county contracted case managers.
- People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ may receive EW services.
 - Elderly Waiver services are paid and authorized through the health plan.

Seniors in SNBC with Changing Needs Not on a Waiver

- Change comes in many forms.
 - Suddenly like a tidal wave.
 - Creeps along incrementally like a glacier.
- Sudden tragedy leads to difficult choices for Seniors and their care givers (loss of care giver, loss of spouse)
- Adverse health effects contribute to an increased demand for medical/social care (simple surgery develop medical complications).
- Seniors often underestimate their fragility and find themselves in sudden need of moving to assisted living or needing supports beyond Personal Care Assistance (PCA).
- People's needs change and may forgot to tell their care coordinator.
- The fear: Senior's needs will NOT be met timely.
 - If Seniors end up in a nursing home due to lack of ability to access timely EW services there is an emotional cost to the person and a system cost.

Meeting Senior's Needs

- Seniors have an option for receiving services through an integrated program MSHO.
 - Evaluation showing the benefits of integrating programs (MSHO).
- People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ may CONTINUE to receive services authorized under all disability waiver programs providing they continue to meet all eligibility criteria.
 - Waiver services continue to be paid Fee-for-Service.
 - People will keep their county case manager for authorization of waiver services.
- People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ receive timely EW services.
 - Elderly Waiver services are coordinated and paid through the health plan.

Recommendation Consistent Policy

- As of January 1, 2017 people in SNBC who turn 65 be mandated into a senior managed care program if they continue to meet the eligibility criteria to enroll in managed care. MSHO/MSC+
 - People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ may CONTINUE to receive services authorized under all disability waiver programs and will continue with their current county or county contracted waiver case manager.
 - People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ may have <u>immediate</u> access to EW services if a need is identified by an assessment.
- People will be automatically enrolled in the MSC+ health plan that provided their SNBC coverage, if that health plan is available to them in their county of residence.
 - Potential to have same health plan care coordinator.
- If the above option is not available the person will be able to choose from the MSC+ plans available in their county.
- People who turn 65 who have a medical spenddown and do not choose MSHO will return to Fee-for-Service.

What Changes for Seniors Moving into MSC+ or MSHO

- Timely access to Elderly Waiver (EW) Services.
- Opportunity to enroll in a health plan that offers an Integrated Medicare- Medicaid Primary, Acute, Behavioral and Long Term Support Services (MSHO). Or
- Enroll in Minnesota Senior Care Plus (MSC+)
- In addition to EW services may receive skilled nurse visit, home health aide, home care therapies, personal care assistant and home care nursing through the health plan.

What Remains the Same for Seniors Moving to MSHO/MSC+

- Currently there are people enrolled in MSHO and MSC+ that receive services that are authorized and paid for under waivers for people with disabilities.
 - MSHO 1051
 - MSC+ 525
- People enrolled in MSHO/MSC+ CONTINUE to receive waiver services authorized under all disability waiver programs and will continue with their current county or county contracted waiver case manager.
 - as long as all other waiver eligibility criteria are met and
 - they chose to remain on a waiver for people with disabilities.

- Plan to transition this population to managed care if they do not meet any of the exclusions to managed care enrollment.
 - Do not want to have this population transition twice in six months.
- Ask of Stakeholders to review letters that DHS will send to people 65 and over.
