

Developmental Disability

Developmental disabilities encompass a broad range of conditions that result from cognitive and/or physical impairments. They are identified before the age of 22 and usually last throughout a person's lifetime.

Some of these disabilities include:

- Autism spectrum disorders
- Down syndrome
- Language and learning disorders,
- Cerebral palsy,
- Intellectual disabilities
- Others



Traumatic Brain Injury

- Prolonged lack of oxygen (anoxic brain injury)
- Infections, such as encephalitis or meningitis
- Encephalopathy (including severe dehydration or overhydration, illness of the liver or pancreas, disruption of the heart, and exposure to toxic chemicals or drugs)
- Decreased flow of oxygen (hypoxic injury)
- Brain tumors
- Trauma caused when the head is hit hard or whipped violently back and forth



Serious and Persistent Mental Illness

As defined by Minnesota statutes "Serious and persistent mental illness," as defined in section 245.462, subdivision 20

The referral must come from

- County Case Worker
- Mental Health Professional
- Residential/Foster Care/Assisted Living staff member

Individual must be on a MN Healthcare program



Services Provided

- Exam and charting
- Full Mouth X-rays
- Prophylaxis/Scaling and Root Planning
- Fluoride treatment
- Restorative
- Endodontic
- Extractions
- Prosthodontic



Hospital Dentistry

To schedule an appointment

- Call from parent, case worker, mental health professional or agency staff to our clinic
- Provide intake information
- 3) We will send out new patient paperwork to guardian or caregiver
- 4) When <u>all</u> paperwork has been received, which includes court papers for proof of guardianship, we will call and schedule an appointment
 - X-rays, cleaning, comprehensive exam, and treatment plan discussed



Legal Guardian, Case Worker, Agency Staff, Parent(s), Consumer

- Are responsible for making/canceling/rescheduling appointments
- Are contacts for the dental clinic to discuss all treatment options
- Are who we rely on for follow through with treatment plans (i.e. home care and attending appointments)
