

National Core Indicators Surveys

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Background

- Collaborative effort between states, state agencies, the National Association of State Directors of Developmental Disabilities Services (NADDDDS), the National Association of States United for Aging and Disabilities (NASUAD), and Human Services Research institute (HSRI).
- Standard set of performance and outcome measures
 - Track individual state progress over time
 - Compare results across states
 - Establish national benchmarks
- Strengthen LTSS policy
- Inform quality assurance activities
- Establish quality improvement priorities

Suite of Surveys

- Face-to-face interviews (with background information from MMIS)
 - Adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (NCI-AC)
 - Older adults and adults with physical disabilities (NCI-AD)
- Mailed Surveys
 - Families of adults with I/DD living at home
 - Families/Guardians of adults with I/DD living in the community
 - Families of children with I/DD
- On-line Survey
 - Staff Stability Survey regarding direct support professionals serving adults with I/DD
