This webinar aims to help child protection caseworkers prepare for, interview, assess, and case-plan with perpetrators of domestic violence. The role and appropriate use of Batterer Intervention Programs will also be discussed, as will the need to collaborate with other systems and providers to ensure offender accountability.
