
Rate each portion of the virtual conference




Rank from most important to least the eight domains livability Domain specific ranking score




Rank from most important to least the eight domains livability Domain 3 Housing




Rank from most important to least the eight domains livability Domain 2 Transportation




Rank from most important to least the eight domains livability Domain 8 Community and Health Services










Rank from most important to least the eight domains livability Domain 1 Outdoor Spaces and Buildings




