General summary

Tamarack Court Assisted Living is located in the rural city of Bemidji, in northwest Minnesota. Bemidji's 2016 census population was 14,942. Tamarack Court Assisted Living is in a residential area, on the privately owned Eldercare of Bemidji's continuum-of-care campus that includes independent living, assisted living, rehabilitative care, skilled nursing care and memory care. Tamarack Court, a 32-unit apartment-style assisted living facility, is the most recent addition to the campus, which opened the summer of 2008.

At the time of the on-site visit, a total of 36 people lived and received services in the setting. Four of the 32 units were occupied by two people, by choice. Eight of the 36 people received waiver-funded services.

Customized living provider standards/qualifications

Licensure requirements and other state regulations for customized living services clearly distinguish these services/settings from institutional licensure or regulations.

Customized living services are provided in housing-with-services establishments with the service provider directly licensed as a comprehensive home care provider by the Minnesota Department of Health. Customized living services provide an individualized package of regularly scheduled health-related and supportive services provided to a person who lives in a qualified, registered housing-with-services establishment.

Customized living service definitions that support the setting requirements

Customized living (CL) and 24-hour CL services include component services designed to meet the person's assessed needs and goals. Individualized CL services may include supervision, home care aide tasks (e.g., assistance with activities of daily living), home health aide task (e.g., delegated nursing tasks), home management tasks, meal preparation and service, socialization, assisting enrollees with arranging meetings and appointments, assisting with money management, assisting participants with scheduling medical and social services and arranging for or providing transportation. If socialization is provided, it must be part of the service plan, related to established goals and outcomes and not diversional or recreational in nature.

People who receive services at Tamarack Court Assisted Living have access to a variety of transportation options, including the HCBS setting's van and bus, the city bus "Paul Bunyan Transit," taxi services, community volunteer drivers "Northwoods Caregivers," family vehicles and Medivan. There is also an adult day program located within Bemidji that provides transportation to and from that setting, if requested.	
	The setting provides HCBS services in a space that is distinct from the space that institutional services are provided. Community engagement opportunities and experiences

Tamarack Court Assisted Living offers a variety of group and individual activities that people have a choice to participate in on a daily basis. Activities calendars are developed monthly with the input from people who receive services in the setting. Monthly calendars are also developed by the other facilities on the campus and people living in any of the settings are free to attend any of the activities at any setting of their choice. Tamarack Court Assisted Living also gives a weekly calendar to each person as a reminder of activity choices occurring during the week.

Being located in "lakes country," Tamarack Court Assisted Living accesses the campus bus to use the lakes and scenery for many community activities: Some group activities facilitated by the setting include:

- Fishing
- Boating
- Sightseeing
- Trips to the library

Administration reports that people who receive services at Tamarack Court Assisted Living attend many community activities either independently, driving themselves or with their families who bring them to a variety of community functions, such as church, visiting the family home or lake cabin, fishing, bowling, shopping, family reunions and weddings. One person interviewed reported she went to the family lake cabin and stayed for the week. Staff reported another resident went to Oregon to visit her sister for an extended stay.

The setting also provides several types of activities on site:

- Father's Day breakfast
- Vegetable and flower gardening
- Card games
- Baking
- Bingo
- Church services
- Bible study
- Music programs including an Elvis impersonator

For example, one person is a retired music teacher. She volunteers to play the piano daily at the nursing facility during the noon meal for the enjoyment of the people living there. She also plays piano for various activities and functions at Tamarack Court Assisted Living.	
Other people volunteer to share their skills in quilting, crotchet, sewing, selling items they baked, such as lefse, at bake sales and gardening. One person worked as an auditor before retirement. She volunteers by being in charge of the setting's guest sign in book.

Public comment summary

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) did not receive public comments for this setting.

DHS sought public comment for 30 days (Feb. 6-March 7, 2019) before submitting settings to the Centers Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) for heightened scrutiny.

We sought public comments using the following methods:

- Evidentiary packages posted online on the <u>Home and Community Based Services Rule</u> <u>transition plan page</u>
- Evidentiary packages specific to each setting posted in a common area of the setting
- Notice of public comment period via <u>Feb. 6, 2019, eList announcement</u>
- Notification to lead agencies via regional resource specialists
- Notification to providers via email
- Notification to managed care organizations and Area Agencies on Aging (AA) via email
- Notification to long-term care ombudsman office via email
- Disability Hub MN virtual insight panel.

Minnesota's recommendation

Date of recommendation: 4/1/2019

Minnesota supports that this setting overcomes the institutional presumption and meets the requirements of a home and community-based setting. Provider is required to maintain on-going compliance with all HCBS requirements.
