✓ Community of practice defined



"A community of practice encourages the translation of knowledge into action and provides a framework for information sharing, competence development, rich discussion, and mentoring; and creates, organizes, revises, and shares knowledge among members of the community." (Seaman, 2008)

- ✓ Purposes of the SUD CoP identified "The purposes of the community of practice are to improve treatment outcomes for individuals with substance use disorders and reduce disparities by using evidence-based and best practices through peer-to-peer and person-to-provider sharing." (Minnesota Statutes 2021, Chapter 254B.151)
- ✓ Deliverables for RFP finalized
- ✓ Gaps in substance use disorder treatment services identified
- ✓ Discussion how the six objectives of the SUD CoP will be accomplished
- ✓ Shared meeting practices finalized
- o RFP status update- purpose of vendor, launching of SUD CoP
