PCA and CFSS training on how to add an authorized agent in MPSE

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) will implement the personal care assistance (PCA) and community first services and supports (CFSS) Cost Reporting Program in March 2024. PCA and CFSS organizations must update the contact information in the Minnesota Provider Screening and Enrollment (MPSE) portal for the person designated as their authorized agent who will submit the PCA and CFSS cost report. PCA and CFSS organizations must update this information by Dec. 31, 2023.

DHS is offering training to providers on how to add an authorized agent in MPSE for cost reporting. The class will be offered on Nov. 30, 2023, from 11 a.m. to noon. Sign up for the free training through the MPSE portal training webpage.

Provider responsibilities to certain MHCP members with reinstated coverage

The Minnesota Department of Human Services will reinstate the Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) coverage for 12,745 individuals whose cases were closed for not completing a renewal form but should have had their coverage auto renewed according to guidance issued by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) in August 2023.

The guidance from CMS clarified that states must perform auto renewal processes (also called ex parte processes) at the individual member level, instead of at the household level. Minnesota's eligibility auto renewal processes occur on a household level and, as a result, some impacted individuals with July, August, and September 2023 renewal dates will have their coverage reinstated.

We will manually reinstate coverage for these individuals (ensuring no gap in coverage), renew their eligibility, and start sending out reinstatement notices in the upcoming weeks.

What providers need to do

- Know that impacted MHCP members have been told to bring a copy of their reinstatement notice to their clinic or pharmacy.
- Refund the MHCP member and bill MHCP if the member contacts you with a reinstatement notice and has been billed for covered services during a period of disenrollment that fits these circumstances.

PCA and CFSS organizations must update authorized agent information in MPSE for Cost Reporting Program

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) will implement the personal care assistance (PCA) and community first services and supports (CFSS) Cost Reporting Program in March 2024. The program will help DHS provide the Legislature an accurate picture of wages, benefits, and other important business costs for PCA and CFSS services. All PCA and CFSS providers must participate in this program under <u>Minnesota Statutes</u>, <u>256B.851</u>.

PCA and CFSS organizations must update the contact information in the <u>Minnesota Provider Screening and Enrollment</u> (<u>MPSE</u>) portal for the person designated as their authorized agent who will submit the PCA and CFSS cost report. PCA and CFSS organizations must update this information by **Dec. 31, 2023**.

The authorized agent must be someone who can act on behalf of the organization and is familiar with your organization's business expenses. Use the steps in the MPSE User Manual to add or update an <u>owner or authorized person</u> or to update the email for the person selected as the authorized agent. DHS will email information about the new cost reporting requirement to the email address for the authorized agent listed in MPSE.

An organization's authorized agent can complete the cost report themselves or create user accounts for other staff at the provider organization to enter cost data. However, only the agent designated in MPSE can sign and submit the information in the cost report.

DHS can only contact one authorized agent from a provider organization regarding the cost reporting requirement. If there are multiple authorized agents listed in a provider's MPSE account, DHS will communicate with the authorized agent who has been registered with MPSE the longest.

If your organization would like to change the authorized agent designated to complete the cost report after cost reporting begins, email <u>dhs.DWRScostreporting@state.mn.us</u> as staff will not see authorized agent changes made in MPSE at that point.

Providers must post distribution plan showing compliance with rate increase spending requirement

The Minnesota Legislature authorized rate increases for selected Elderly Waiver (EW), Alternative Care (AC) and Essential Community Supports (ECS) services effective Jan. 1, 2024. All EW, AC and ECS providers that receive a rate increase must use 80% of the increase in revenue to increase compensation-related costs for the staff they hire directly.

By Jan. 1, 2024, providers must prepare and post a distribution plan for their use of the rate increase. The distribution plan must be available for at least six months to all staff and available to the Aging and Adult Services Division (AASD) upon request. The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) may recoup funds from providers who do not comply with this requirement.

Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) implements National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) edits for drug testing

CMS implemented NCCI procedure-to-procedure edits effective July 1, 2023, on the 2023 Q4 NCCI PTP Edits - Practitioner Services spreadsheet on its <u>Medicaid NCCI Edit Files</u> webpage for the following codes:

• Column 1 codes 80305, 80306 and 80307 for presumptive tests

• Column 2 codes G0480 – G0483 and G0659 for definitive tests

We are aware that CMS will allow the use of a modifier to bypass the edits when billing codes in Column 1 and Column 2 together under allowable circumstances.

You should continue to submit drug testing claims as normal. We are updating our system and we will reprocess claims back to July 1, 2023. We will publish a message on this webpage after we have updated the system and are ready to reprocess the claims. We do not guarantee payment after reprocessing if the claim is not submitted following MHCP guidelines. (pub. 10/31/23)

Paid Individualized Education Program (IEP) claims reprocessed for fiscal year (FY) 2021-2022

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) will reprocess the paid IEP claims for FY 2021-2022 (July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022) between Nov. 1-30, 2023. We will reprocess paid IEP claims in order of the original number you have in our system, or your National Provider Identifier number. This process takes approximately two weeks to finalize. Claims are reprocessed every two weeks.

You can have your remittance advice only list final paid claims for FY 2021-2022. If you would like to do this, wait to submit claims until Dec. 1, 2023.

DHS calculated and reviewed the final IEP rates for FY 2021-2022; and entered the rates in the Medicaid Management Information System before reprocessing.

Silver diamine fluoride applications covered, new social-emotional screening tools allowed at Child and Teen Checkups (C&TC) exams

Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) now covers silver diamine fluoride applications at any age-related C&TC visit and allows two new social-emotional screening tools for children under 5 years old.

You may apply silver diamine fluoride effective Oct. 1, 2023, to a tooth or teeth when there is a visible need identified during the open-mouth exam at a C&TC visit. Review the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry's <u>Physician Use of Silver Diamine Fluoride in Dental Caries Management (PDF)</u> for guidance. You should bill per tooth per date of service using Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) code 0792T.

You may use the Survey of Well-being of Young Children (SWYC) Baby Pediatric Symptom Checklist and the Preschool Pediatric Symptom Checklist for social-emotional screening for children under age 5 years in the C&TC clinic setting. The American Academy of Pediatrics accepts these parent report tools. We have updated the C&TC section of the MHCP Provider Manual, and the Minnesota Department of Health is updating its C&TC Developmental and Social Emotional Screening in the Clinic Setting webpage to reflect this change. Reminder: Waiver allowing PCA agencies to bill for services provided by certain family members ends Nov. 11

We explained on Sept. 27 on this webpage that the temporary waiver allowing personal care assistance (PCA) agencies to hire certain family members to be paid to provide PCA services ends Nov. 11, 2023. This is a reminder this temporary waiver will end Nov. 11, 2023.

The family members that the waiver allowed to be paid for providing PCA services were:

- Parents of minors
- Stepparents of minors
- Legal guardians of minors

Spouses

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) previously announced an extension of the end date for this waiver in a May 12, 2023, eList.

Effective **Nov. 12, 2023**, Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) or a person's managed care organization (MCO) cannot pay PCA agencies for claims with dates of service provided after Nov. 11, 2023, by these family members.

People and families should work together with their PCA agency to develop an alternative plan for providing PCA services. They can contact their lead agency (county, tribal government, or managed care organization) for additional support if they continue to struggle with staffing.

Revalidation for next set of providers begins Nov. 1, 2023

Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) will send revalidation notices Nov. 1, 2023, to the following provider types:

- Financial Management Services (FMS) provider type 38
- Hospitals provider type 01
- Hospice provider type 02
- Durable Medical Supplies provider type 76
- Transportation providers provider type 82
- Early Intensive Developmental and Behavioral Intervention organizations provider type EI
- Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) providers provider type 18 with practice name starting with letter R; and S through Z who previously were not sent a revalidation letter in 2022.

Providers due for revalidation will receive a revalidation notice in the PRVLTR folder of their MN–ITS mailbox Nov. 1, 2023. MHCP will mail the revalidation notice via the U.S. Postal Service to the credentialing address on the enrollment record if the provider has not set up a MN–ITS mailbox.

Do not send any revalidation documents until you receive your initial revalidation notice. You will receive a revalidation notice when you are due for revalidation. Do not call the MHCP Provider Resource Center unless you know you are due for revalidation and have not received a revalidation notice.

Revised: Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) offers a new webpage and webinar to guide employers on earned sick and safe time, overtime

We've revised this message to explain we've published it on behalf of DLI. We encourage providers to visit DLI's new <u>FAQs: Earned Sick and Safe Time</u> webpage for more information about the new earned sick and safe time law, which goes into effect Jan. 1, 2024. Questions and answers include example scenarios and different options employers may take to implement the law in their workplaces, including accrual, front-loading and carryover provisions. DLI also posted a new <u>Minnesota's Earned Sick and Safe Time</u> video that gives an overview of the earned sick and safe time law. The video is also available in <u>Somali</u> and <u>Spanish</u> versions.

Medicaid FMAP rate increases for 2024 fiscal year, temporary COVID-19 FMAP rate decreases beginning Oct. 1, 2023

The FMAP rate for claims Minnesota Department of Human Services paid in the 2024 federal fiscal year (on or after Oct. 1, 2023) has increased from 50.79 percent to 51.49 percent (1905[b] of Social Security Act).

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (Public Law No. 116-127, section 6008) provided an additional temporary increase of 6.2 percent in the FMAP rate for Medical Assistance claims paid from Jan. 1, 2020 – March 31, 2023, for the following services for children, parents or guardians with children under 19, individuals 65 and older, and individuals blind or disabled:

- Individualized Education Program
- Rule 5 Children's Residential including Institutions for Mental Disease, which receives a change in state funds equal to the federal fund change
- County-provided targeted case management services (child welfare, mental health and vulnerable adultdevelopmental disability)

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 provides a phase-down approach to the elimination of 6.2 percent of the COVID-19 FMAP rate, decreasing the COVID-19 FMAP to 1.5 percent for claims paid effective Oct. 1, 2023 – Dec. 31, 2023.

The COVID-19 FMAP rate decrease to 1.5 percent and the federal fiscal year FMAP rate increase to 51.49 percent does not apply to adults without children who are eligible under the Affordable Care Act and some other populations already receiving an enhanced FMAP rate.

Counties and providers do not need to do anything to receive the increased FMAP rate. Claims paid on your remittance advices starting Oct. 10, 2023, until end of the quarter (Dec. 31, 2023) will be paid at the new 52.99 percent rate (this includes the additional COVID-19 FMAP phase-down rate).

Targeted Case Management (TCM) interactive video (ITV) denied claims update

TCM services delivered via ITV require the appropriate place of service to be listed on the claim beginning May 12, 2023. Minnesota Department of Human Services has updated its system to reflect this requirement and we will reprocess denied ITV claims. The reprocessed claims will appear on your Oct. 10, 2023, remittance advice. (pub. 10/6/23)

Electronic visit verification (EVV) geofence reduced to 500 feet effective Dec. 1, 2023

Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) will reduce the virtual perimeter around the home address of the member receiving services (known as a geofence) from 500 miles to 500 feet from a member's home effective Dec. 1, 2023. Provider agencies using the state-selected EVV system, HHAeXchange, must select the "community" option by selecting the community box in the mobile application when providing services or visits outside the geofence range. Providers using third-party EVV systems will need to work with their vendors to configure their geofence to 500 feet and actions for visits outside the geofence.

We have also updated the <u>Electronic visit verification</u> webpage to include a list of third-party EVV vendors that have integrated with HHAeXchange. Find the link to the list in the third-party EVV system section on the Minnesota EVV tab of the webpage.

HCBS, home care, PCA and ICF/DD rates and monthly budget changes effective Jan. 1, 2024

The Minnesota Legislature authorized several rates and monthly budget increases effective Jan. 1, 2024, for some home and community-based waiver services (HCBS), home care nursing, home health, personal care assistance (PCA), and intermediate care facility for persons with developmental disabilities (ICF/DD) services. Information about the service rates and budget changes, including links to resources, rate methodologies, instructions, and contacts, can be found on the Long-term services and supports rates changes webpage. Individualized Education Program (IEP) interim rates for fiscal year (FY) 2023-2024

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) will send interim IEP rates for FY 2023-2024 to school districts on Oct. 3, 2023. You will find your rates document in the Miscellaneous Received folder in your MN–ITS mailbox under the IEP file type. The file is named "Interim Rates for FY 2023-2024."

School districts should postpone billing for FY 2023-2024 until Oct. 17, 2023, so we can post the interim rates in the Medicaid Management Information System. We may deny an IEP claim submitted before Oct. 17, 2023, if the rates are not in the school district's rate file.

The final IEP rates calculated for FY 2021-2022 will become the interim IEP rates for the current school year (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024). These rates are calculated based on actual time and encounter data submitted by the school districts and final data from the Minnesota Department of Education for FY 2021-2022.

Updates to Substance Use Disorder 1115 Demonstration provider enrollment

Review the following 1115 Demonstration provider enrollment dates.

Providers requiring Jan. 1, 2024, enrollment date

The following substance use disorder (SUD) providers are required to enroll in the 1115 Demonstration by Jan. 1, 2024:

- Minnesota residential treatment providers licensed by the Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) and enrolled in Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP)
- Minnesota withdrawal management providers licensed by DHS and enrolled in MHCP
- Out-of-state residential SUD providers enrolled in MHCP

Providers requiring Jan. 1, 2025, enrollment date

The following SUD providers are required to enroll in the demonstration by Jan. 1, 2025:

- Minnesota nonresidential treatment providers licensed by DHS and enrolled in MHCP
- Hospital-based residential treatment providers licensed by DHS and enrolled in MHCP

Tribally licensed providers may elect to participate in the demonstration.

DHS extends temporary waiver allowing certain family members to be paid for providing PCA services

During the COVID-19 federal public health emergency, personal care assistance (PCA) agencies were temporarily allowed to hire the following types of family members to be paid to provide PCA services to individuals enrolled in Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP):

- Parents
- Stepparents
- Legal guardians of minors
- Spouses

The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) previously communicated that the federal government announced the allowance for certain family members to provide PCA care to their MHCP-enrolled family member was ending on May 11, 2023, when the federal public health emergency ends. However, on Friday, May 5, 2023, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) notified DHS of a change to federal policy that allowed DHS to apply for a six-month extension to this allowance. The temporary allowance will now continue through **November 11, 2023**.

What this means for PCA agencies and family members who have been providing PCA services:

After May 11, 2023, PCA agencies can continue to hire and pay the family members listed in this message to provide PCA services to members enrolled in MHCP through **November 11, 2023**.

Updated webpage and new tools help Minnesotans keep their health insurance as renewals resume in public health care programs

Minnesota Department of Human Services refreshed the <u>Renew My Coverage</u> webpage and will launch new tools in the coming weeks to make it easier for Minnesotans to keep their health insurance now that annual member eligibility renewals have resumed in public health care programs. Please share this information with the members you serve.

Members should look for:

- A new envelope design to help renewal paperwork stand out better in mailboxes. Envelopes are now marked with a blue circle with the text "Important information enclosed."
- A new <u>document upload tool</u> that allows members to skip the postage and upload their annual eligibility renewal documents online. Enrollees can also submit renewal paperwork by postal mail, dropping it off at their county or tribal office, fax or by giving their information verbally over the phone.

Members will soon be able to:

- Use a new renewal date lookup tool to find out when to watch their mail for renewal information.
- Receive text messages from the number "28343" when it's time to fill out and submit their renewal paperwork.

We are committed to ensuring that eligible Minnesotans retain their public coverage when renewal processes resume as required by Congressional legislation that <u>states to return to standard Medicaid eligibility procedures</u>. On the <u>Renew my</u> <u>coverage</u> webpage, we have created a one-stop shop for Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare members with all the information they need about how to keep their insurance.

The most important thing enrollees can do now to prepare for their renewal is to <u>Update their contact information</u>. Members who have moved in the last three years should update their address, phone number and email, so they can be reached.

Renewal information will be mailed to members in monthly waves or "cohorts" each month for the next 12 months. The first group of Minnesotans due for their renewal paperwork will get their renewal information mailed within the next few weeks. (pub. 4/27/23)
