Purpose

The purpose of this council is to describe how positive supports and implementation science are related to addressing barriers to transition into the community from the hospital or other out-of-home placements. The Statute (Pursuant to Minnesota Laws Chapter 61, Section 82) related to this council states that an action plan will be created recommending how to:

- Improve regional capacity for acute care transitions, including examining the roles and experience of counties and Tribes in delivering services and identifying any conflicting and duplicative roles and responsibilities among health and human services agencies, counties, and Tribes,
- 2. Create a measurement and evaluation system as part of an overall statewide implementation science approach; and
- 3. Design statewide strategies that focus on addressing geographic, racial, and ethnic disparities.
