Your Medical Assistance (MA) is Ending. Action is Needed.

Why am I getting this letter?

You will no longer qualify for Medical Assistance (MA) starting October 1, 2026, because of a new federal law. If you get help paying Medicare premiums and costs through a Medicare Savings Program, you will no longer qualify for this help beginning October 1, 2026. The new law changes which immigration statuses can qualify for these programs. The immigration status we have on file for you is not eligible under the new law. We will send you a separate closure notice in the mail soon.

What do I need to do?

Contact the agency listed at the top left of this notice right away to report if:

- Your immigration status has changed.
- You are now a U.S. citizen or U.S. national.
- You are pregnant.

If these changes have occurred, you may still be eligible for MA. If not, you may qualify for MinnesotaCare or Emergency Medical Assistance (EMA) when your MA ends. MinnesotaCare has comprehensive coverage which includes doctor visits, preventive care, prescriptions, and other health services. EMA covers limited services related to a medical emergency only.

If you want to request MinnesotaCare coverage, do one of the following:

- Go online September 1, 2026, or soon after to apply for MinnesotaCare. To start your online application, go to <https://people.mets.dhs.mn.gov/universal/login>. You will need to create or sign in to your LoginMN account before you can apply. You may be asked to verify your identity to create or sign in to LoginMN, or
- Call the agency listed at the top left of this notice right away and ask to be reviewed for MinnesotaCare eligibility. You can find a link for agency phone numbers on the next page, or
- Complete the enclosed Supplement to the Minnesota Health Care Programs Application for Certain Populations (DHS-6696B) and mail it to the agency listed at the top left of this notice right away.

If you have a medical emergency and want to request Emergency Medical Assistance (EMA):

- Call or submit a written request to the agency listed at the top left of this notice and ask to be reviewed for EMA eligibility.

 - If you are eligible for MinnesotaCare, you may have to pay a monthly premium for coverage. You will get a billing notice in the mail.
 - Your coverage begins the month after the Minnesota Department of Human Services receives your premium payment. This means that for coverage to begin October 1, 2026, you must pay your MinnesotaCare premium by noon (12:00 P.M.) on September 30, 2026.
