

#### State Opioid Response Team

- Grant managers have completed negotiation meetings with new OERAC awardees and working to execute those contracts.
- Also, working on completing grant amendments to carryforward unspent funds.
- Onboarding three new grant managers.
- Preparing for the December 1<sup>st</sup> OERAC meeting, which will take place in Hastings, MN. The Council will discuss plans for the next RFP and legislative recommendations.

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#### Updates: Promotion, Prevention and Early Intervention

#### Updates: SUD Reform & Redesign Team

- SUD Paperwork Reduction & Systems Improvement: Vendor will be doing in person visits to a variety of types of 245G programs and conducting key informant interviews in the coming weeks.
- <u>SUD Community of Practice:</u> Next meeting December 19<sup>th</sup>. Discussion will be focused on ASAM and gaps in SUD continuum.
- Residential SUD Providers: Deadline to enroll in ASAM level(s) of care is January 1, 2024.
- <u>1115 SUD System Reform Demonstration Waiver:</u> Public comment closed on October 27<sup>th</sup>. Demonstration Extension Request to be submitted to CMS this month.
- ASAM 4<sup>th</sup> Edition Manual: DHS in the process of securing one 4<sup>th</sup> Edition Manual for each licensed and Tribal Nation SUD program. More information will be shared.

#### Updates: American Indian Team

- Work continues on getting amendments completed for the grantees that are wanting to carry forward unspent funds.
- Introductory talks have begun with tribes that want to develop some form of Withdrawal Management.
- American Indian Summit strategic plan is still in draft but is moving in a positive direction but with assurance that it is inclusive of the majority of recommendations that came out of the summit.
- American Indian Team is developing a communication plan that will better fit the need to inform partners in a consistent manner.
- Next AIAC meeting is set for January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2024 site TBD.

#### **Updates: SUD Clinical Policy Team**

- 1. DAANES changes
  - a. Comp assessment to Service Initiation Date
  - b. Eligibility span from 183 days to 1 year
  - c. Upcoming trainings
- 2. State Plan Amendment changes will be posted for public comment in the next week or two
  - a. Peer recovery qualifications, removing high school diploma
  - b. Adding ASAM Residential levels of care
  - c. Adding Hospital, FQHCs, and RHCs as eligible vendors of Comprehensive Assessments
  - d. Adding Counties as eligible vendors of peer recovery support services
- **3. OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAM WORK GROUP** In process of finishing draft of legislative report and recommendations (Chapter 61, Article 4, Sec. 24)
- 4. ENROLLMENT AND REQUIREMENTS FOR PEER RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES VENDORS

  Stakeholder engagement in process, recommendations due early next year to the legislature (Chapter 61, Article 4, Sec. 25)
- 5. MN 245G Comprehensive Assessment Reference Guide posted
