Waiver Reimagine Service Menu

Service menus are the structured lists of services available to individuals for each the Individual Support Waiver and Residential Support Waiver.

- In 2021, as part of Waiver Reimagine Phase 1, all disability waivers (CADI, CAC, BI, and DD) services were consolidated.
 - Today, the same 32 services are available for each CADI, CAC, BI, DD
- Services can be found on Minnesota's [Community-Based Services Manual \(CBSM\)](#):
 - Service definition
 - Covered services
 - Non-covered services
 - Limitations, requirements, etc.

Waiver Reimagine Service Menu

Upon Waiver Reimagine go-live, DHS' plans include:

- Ensuring each waiver will have a tailored menu of services designed to meet the specific needs and preferences of the people it serves.
 - All 32 services remain available in either the Individual Support Waiver and/or Residential Support Waiver.
 - There will be significant crossover of services between the two waivers, despite, not all services will be available on both waivers.
- Creating fewest changes to existing service structures as possible.
- Establishing guiding principles to serve as the basis for our plans.

Available only on Individual Support Waiver (ISW)	Available only on Residential Support Waiver (RSW)
Caregiver Living Expenses	Community Residential Services
Consumer Directed Community Supports (CDCS)	Customized Living
Environmental Accessibility Adaptations	Family Residential Services
Night Supervision	Integrated Community Supports

This table demonstrates our plans for services that will be available on only one of the two new waivers, upon waiver reimagine go-live.

- At this time, CDCS will only be available on the ISW as existing rules prohibit duplication of services. Post go-live, DHS will continue working to develop a service model that will allow self-direction on the RSW.
- Home modifications and vehicle modifications will no longer be CDCS service categories. Instead, people can use EAA as a traditional service.

Waiver Reimagine in/out of budget

- **Inside of budget:** Services 'inside' the budget are subject to and paid for within a person's individual budget range.
- **Outside the budget:** Services that are 'outside' the budget are excluded from the individual budget range and are funded separately. Services outside the budget typically meet these criteria:
 - Low utilization
 - High cost
 - Medical, professional need(s)
 - Have or can have proper controls in place at the time of go-live

Waiver Reimagine in/out of budget

This table demonstrates services that are planned to be outside the budget, upon waiver reimagine go-live.


- Services not listed here are planned to be inside the budget.
