

## 2020 - 2021 New Licensing Requirements & Technical Assistance Family Child Care

There are several new licensing requirements for family child care that county licensors will monitor for beginning September 30, 2020. The new requirements are listed below. From September 30, 2020, to September 30, 2021, licensors will use this form during all annual licensing inspections (re-licensing, and off-year) to determine whether a provider is in compliance with the new requirements. If a provider is not in compliance with one or more of the requirements, the licensor will provide technical assistance on the requirement(s) and how the provider can come into compliance. The items will not be cited in a correction order. The provider then has 30 days to come into compliance with the identified requirements. The licensor will check for compliance with the identified items at the next annual inspection. This form will be left with the provider for their reference, but they do not need to post this form.
