

## Landscape of Benefit Cliff Tools

### **FRS and Benefit Cliffs**

NCCP undertook a landscape review of benefit calculators to inform our work on the [Family Resource Simulator \(FRS\)](#). The first of its kind when it was launched in 2004, the FRS is a publicly available, online tool that helps states develop effective policies to support low-income families. It has been used by advocates, policymakers, and program administrators to improve state and federal rules for benefits programs that have helped millions of low-income families.

The FRS allows users to assess the impact of the eligibility rules and support levels provided by comprehensive packages of benefits on family budgets that are tailored to specific family situations and geographic locations. It not only estimates the value of public benefits received by families, but also estimates family expenses, to calculate a family's available net resources. The FRS models the complex interactions between program rules and how eligibility and support for one program may impact eligibility and supports provided by another program in ways that harm low-income families' economic mobility. For example, the FRS pinpoints "benefit cliffs" - when families lose thousands of dollars in support due to small increases in income. In this manner, the FRS demonstrates both where public benefit programs can be improved and how important they are at keeping families afloat.

### **Landscape Review**

Based on our review, the FRS fulfills a key need in the field. The FRS is the most comprehensive benefit calculator currently available, including more public benefits than any other calculator. The FRS, unlike most benefit calculators, not only models complex public benefit program interactions, but also provides a dynamic budget calculator, which highlights gaps in the social safety net for working families. Further, the FRS has the following important characteristics that demonstrate its reliability and sustainability: built at the state-level for multiple states, long history, still in use/recently updated, and publicly available. Over its 16-year history, the FRS has led to key policy changes in multiple states, which have improved the economic security of millions of low-income families.

This landscape review aims to further highlight the nuances of each tool, by dividing them into categories based on their inclusion of: **Income/Benefits and Basic Budget**, **Income/Benefits Only**, and **Basic Budget Only**.

For each tool, we also provide the following information, where available:

- Organization that developed the tool
- Tool's primary funder(s)
- Dates the tool was created and last updated
- Tool's primary geographic focus
- Tool's primary audience (whether the tool is intended to educate policymakers, researchers, organizations, or individual families/caseworkers)
- The benefits (e.g. TANF, SNAP, CCDF, EITC) included in the tool
- Whether the tool is publicly available and a link to the tool

The tools on this list came from three sources: NCCP staff's knowledge of the field, a review of current research about calculator tools, and internet searches, using search terms such as "eligibility calculators," "basic income calculators," and "self-sufficiency calculators."
