  - Request for data on ESL or limited English proficiency cases in CP (ACTION: Gapske will research or contact CQI)
  - Request for data on disproportionality in CP cases (ACTION: Gapske will research or contact CQI)
  - Request for data on immigration status (ACTION: Gapske will research or contact CQI)
